



2004 Season in Review

career goal by Megan Kolts and goals from Andrea Kerkoff, Kim Turner and Katie Randolph. Prewitt's second hat trick tied a school record, matching Stacey Hall's performance during the 1997 season.

With six goals in two matches, Prewitt was named Conference USA Offensive Player of the Week on Aug. 30, the first time she was honored. It was also the first honor by a Lady Eagle since Stacy Hall was recognized in 2000.

Following a 0-0 tie against Tennessee-Martin in the opening match of the Kelme Port City Classic hosted by South Alabama, the Lady Eagles claimed the tournament title with a 2-0 win over Stetson, behind Prewitt's seventh goal of the season and the first from Sarah Brennan. Prewitt was named the tournament's MVP, while Micah Stephens and Katie McClary were named to the all-tournament team.

Southern Miss then traveled to Birmingham-Southern, earning its fourth win of the season by virtue of a 3-2 victory as Carly Barkley scored her first two goals of the season, while Prewitt added her eighth. The victory also had Southern Miss off to its best start at 4-0-1 since opening the 2001 season with a 5-0-1 record.

From there, the squad came up short in a trio of one-goal matches, 2-1 at South Alabama, despite Prewitt's ninth goal of the season before returning home to open Conference USA action but fell 2-1 to TCU and 1-0 to Houston.

The Lady Eagles snapped their three-match losing streak against Cincinnati, defeating the Lady Bearcats, 1-0, to improve to 5-3-1 on the season. The win was also significant, as Southern Miss claimed its first road Conference USA victory since winning at TCU on Oct. 11, 2002.

But the rest of the season would not be as kind, as Southern Miss was not able to win another match in 2004, closing out the season on an eight-match losing streak. The team had a bit of tough luck in that

stretch, as four of those matches were one-goal matches, with the Lady Eagles on the short end, while another was a two-goal match.

Seven Lady Eagle seniors, Prewitt, Kay Beth Costilow, Emily Anne Chenoweth, Jill Picaut, Katie Randolph, Anna Snyder and Leslie Schoepflein, ended their careers against Centenary on Oct. 24, a 2-1 defeat. Their collegiate careers came to a close on Oct. 30 at Tulane, dropping a 1-0 contest as the team's season came to a close with a 5-11-1 overall record, and 1-9 mark in Conference USA.

The season did not come without accolades, as

Prewitt recorded the fourth-best single season performance in school history, finishing with nine goals and also tying for the seventh-best performance in points with 20. Her season garnered third team All-Conference USA honors as she became the eighth Lady Eagle to be tabbed All-Conference USA. She also was named to the *ESPN The Magazine* Academic All-District VI team for the second time in her career.

The 2004 season was a new beginning for the Lady Eagle soccer program as it ushered in a new coach, Gail Macklin, who became the program's third coach on June 29, 2004. Macklin had previously been an assistant under former coach Matt Clark and a volunteer assistant. She also played collegiate soccer at Southern Miss from 1997-99 and was one of the program's founding members in 1997.

Entering her first season, Macklin and her staff inherited 11 returning starters and 21 letterwinners for the season, one that was expected to be successful because of the squad's experience.

Early in the season, it looked as if the Lady Eagles were headed in that direction. The team opened its season at home against Samford and gave Macklin her first win, behind Lauren Prewitt's hat trick, the first of her career and first since Tricia Wiles recorded one in 2001.

The team improved to 2-0 for the first time since the 2001 season with a 7-2 win at Arkansas-Little Rock, behind another hat trick performance from Prewitt, the first
